This session will cover the organizational structure of the Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA), the basic components of the Voc Rehab system, and the process of working with Voc Rehab for obtaining employment or training services for students transitioning to adulthood. Topics included will be: State Coverage; The Program; The Process: Referral; Application; Eligibility Determination; Individualized Plan for Employment; Service Implementation; Employment and Case Closure. In addition, new components for VR will be discussed, including: The New VR Services Model: The Discovery Process: Job Shadow; Situational Assessment; Vocational Counseling and Guidance; Other Discovery Activities.
